

Born to be Proud: invitation for your school

We would love for your school to join our 2nd annual Born to be Proud project for Pride in London 2019. After such a successful project in 2018, Diversity Role Models (DRM) and Deutsche Bank (DB) have teamed up for a second year. This year the 'Born to be Proud' project is going to be even bigger and better but not without your involvement.

This opportunity for your school to partner with Diversity Role Models and Deutsche Bank is an opportunity to stand together to celebrate diversity and create a world where future generations accept and support difference. Your school will receive a number of benefits including a day of student workshops (ideally for Year 9 or 10) and a staff training session.

In addition to the school based delivery, a selected group of young people will take part in a 4-part series of skills sessions hosted by Deutsche Bank. These students will be taught the workplace skills to design and plan the group's presence, including a float, at Pride in London on 6th July 2019.

The planning project is limited to a small number of students, that will be selected by yourselves, but through the delivery of our student workshops whole year groups will be able to experience our work. More information about our student workshops can be found [here](#).

Students nominated for the project will be expected to attend the school workshop, the four project planning sessions at Deutsche Bank, and the Pride parade itself on 6th July. Schools will be responsible for ensuring that they obtain any parental permissions required, and for providing a member of staff to accompany their students at the Pride parade. (A member of staff may also need to accompany students to the project planning sessions, depending on the age of the students and your school's policies and procedures.)
